Glassboro's VFW Hall Is Open To The Public

Located on the corner of Wilmer and Sewell Streets, across from Owens Field is Glassboro's VFW Hall. Built in January 1960, the Hall has served the community and our Veterans of Foreign Wars with a place to meet and hold special events.

Over last 40+ years, the building has experienced some wear and tear and, with the World War II Veterans still holding command of the property, it was getting harder and harder to make those necessary repairs to keep the building operable.

So, the state stepped in and asked the Glassboro Veterans to partner with the South Jersey Vietnam Veterans to renovate the hall and create a home for both groups of Veterans to share along with the newer Veterans of Foreign Wars.

The Vietnam Veterans have volunteered countless hours to renovate the entire interior of the building and the state, through the Department of Community Affairs is providing funding for a new roof.

Housing Rehab Money Available

The Borough continues to offer two rehabilitation grant programs for eligible, low to moderate-income homeowners.

The Regional Contribution Agreement (RCA) grant provides up to \$20,000 for health and safety repairs. With RCA funding, at least \$10,000 must be used for a major system repair, like a new roof, windows, siding, heating system, etc. The rest of the money can be used for other health and safety repairs to bring a residence up to Borough code.

The COAH grant, Council on Affordable Housing, also provides income eligible homeowners funding for health and safety repairs.

Glassboro residents interested in applying for either the RCA or COAH program can obtain an application at the new GED Office now located at North Main Street.

LOCAL

POOLS- -Starting Spring 2007, if you plan to install a swimming pool, hot tub or spa or renovate an existing unit, there are numerous construction code changes that may affect your installation. There are new bonding requirements as per the National Electric Code Section 680.26 (C) and (D). Also in the past, only pools with a surface area of 250sf and greater than 24" in depth were regulated. Now, all pools 24" or more in depth are regulated. This definition includes the commonly used blow-up pool that is 24" or more in depth. For more information, contact the Glassboro Code Enforcement office at 856-881-9230 x313. ☞

PARKING- - - The Police Dept. would like to remind all residents that overnight parking, between the hours of 2am and 6am, is not permitted on any street in Glassboro (Borough Ordinance 445-14(g)). Information about Glassboro ordinances concerning handicapped parking and temporary overnight parking permits can be found on the web at: http://www.e-codes.generalcode.com/codebook_frameset.asp?ep=fs&t=ws&cb=0316_A.

Glassboro's Police Dept. has the authority to permit temporary overnight parking. Permission may be granted upon written or oral request. Permission may be for one night unless specifically authorized by the Dept. for a greater period of time. ☞

RECYCLING- -In 2006, Glassboro sent 6750 tons of trash to the landfill. Bob Goodwin of the NJDEP estimates, if 30% of this trash was paper and was recycled, the Borough would have saved nearly \$150,000 in tipping fees.

The Highway Superintendent does random checks of resident's trash carts. He says that he could check 80% of all of the totes in Glassboro and find paper/cardboard, including pizza boxes, pasta boxes and junk mail. If all residents got on board with recycling, paper/cardboard our tonnage would increase and save us money. Twenty (20) gallon blue recycling containers are available at the Highway Depart. at no charge, call 856-881-8422. ☞

TRASH- -In March, 2006 Glassboro adopted a Stormwater Ordinance #6-13 requiring residents to place yard debris in containers and not in the street.

Residents shall place yard debris in 30 gallon, or less, containers or in biodegradable paper bags not weighting more than 50 lbs, out for collection on their normal trash day. During the months of April, Oct., Nov., and Dec., leaves may be raked to the curb line or along the street and is only allowed the seven (7) days prior to a scheduled and announced collection, and shall not be placed closer than 10' from any storm drain inlet. During all other months, leaves must be containerized and placed at the curb for normal trash collection day. The collection schedule is placed in the Gloucester County Times and on the Glassboro website in March and September prior to collection season.

Several ordinances were adopted under the Stormwater label and can be viewed at glassboroonline.com/highway. ☞

EMERGENCY RESOURCES- -In an effort to keep all Gloucester County residents, school districts and municipalities informed during an emergency and to help stop a potential crisis before it begins, the County has created the GloucesterAlert system.

The GloucesterAlert system allows residents to receive a text message either on their email account (work, home, other), cell phone, text pager, Blackberry or Wireless PDA (Palm, iPAQ, etc.). Gloucester County's Office of Emergency Response is responsible for delivering messages on the system that pertain to traffic, weather and county events, while participating school districts and municipalities that utilize the system are responsible for administering their messages.
