THE BOROUGH OF GLASSBORO RECYCLES: newspaper, glass bottles, aluminum and tin cans, cardboard, plastic bottles (soda, detergent, and milk jugs), brush, grass and leaves via curbside collection. **Motor oil and batteries** can be dropped off during business hours, at the Highway Department located at 125 Grove St.

SINGLE STREAM RECYCLING Includes:

CARDBOARD and NEWSPAPER/JUNK MAIL/COMPUTER PAPER/FOOD BOXES/ETC: All types of paper products. PLEASE do not use cardboard boxes as trash receptacles.

GLASS bottles and jars with caps and rings removed,

ALUMINUM / TIN beverage and food cans

PLASTIC milk jugs, soda, or detergent bottles squashed.

Place all of the Single Stream Recyclables in the Blue cart supplied by the Borough.

GRASS CLIPPINGS: Must be placed in 30 gallon cans or less labeled "GRASS" not weighing more than 50 lbs. NO SOD OR DIRT. Do not use plastic bags.

BRUSH: limbs are to be cut into 4 to 6 feet lengths with butt ends all facing the same way.

LEAVES: raked to the curb line in April, October, November and December. Check the schedule listed on back panel. All other times leaves are to be placed into paper biodegradable bags that can be purchased at Borough Hall. **PLEASE, NO PLASTIC BAGS!**

METAL OBJECTS: not weighing more than 50 lbs. or lengths of 6 feet.

TRASH GUIDELINES

1. **Normal household trash only.** No contractors debris including wood, carpeting, roofing shingles, demolition or remodeling.
2. Residents who do their own construction may place out for collection up to (5) 30-gallon containers not weighing more than 50 lbs. each, per week. Carpets must be cut up into 4' to 6' lengths, rolled and tied. MUST call for BULK pick-up.
3. All household trash must be placed on the curb and not in the street. Trash placed in the gutterline hinders leaf collection, street sweeping and snowplowing.
4. All trash must be put into the green cart. Loose trash must be bagged.
5. Front of cart (steel bar) must face the street
6. Trash is to be placed at the curb no sooner than 3 PM the previous day and empty cans must be removed within 12 hours on your collection day. Trash placed at the curb other than trash day is subject to fines.
7. Notify the Highway Office if you will have **bulk items** or unusual amounts out for trash.
8. Keep recyclables separate from trash.
9. **No hazardous waste will be collected.** You may call 478-6045 for all dates and times of the Hazardous Waste Collection Days at the G.C. Solid Waste Complex on Rt.694 in S. Harrison Twp. after March 1. Go to www.gcianj.com for more information.

LATEX PAINT DISPOSAL:

Do not place liquid paint into the trash. Instead using no more than a ½ can of paint, add a clay based kitty litter or speedy dry to the paint, stir until it thickens (adding more material if necessary). When it is no longer able to be poured, discard can and all into a plastic trash bag and place into cart. NOTE: Oil based paint is flammable and must be disposed of at one of the Household Waste days sponsored by the County.

CHRISTMAS TREE COLLECTION WILL BEGIN ON JANUARY 2nd

Place you're tree out for normal trash collection free of nails, wires, ornaments and bags.

2010 Holiday Trash and Recycling Schedule

MARTIN LUTHER KING BIRTHDAY:

Monday Jan. 18- No Monday Recycling collection – will be collected throughout the week.

LINCOLN'S BIRTHDAY:

Friday February 12 - Normal Trash and Recyclables will be collected.

PRESIDENTS DAY:

Monday Feb. 15 -No Monday Recycling collection – will be collected throughout the week.

GOOD FRIDAY:

Friday April 2- Trash and Recyclables to be collected Monday April 5

MEMORIAL DAY:

Monday May 31 -No Monday Recycling collection – will be collected throughout the week.

NOTE: Trash collection begins at 6am until Labor Day. Highway hours 6am-2pm.

INDEPENDENCE DAY:

Celebrated on Monday July 5 - No Monday Recycling collection – to be collected throughout the week.

LABOR DAY:

Monday Sept 6- No Monday Recycling collection – will be collected throughout the week.

COLUMBUS DAY:

Celebrated Oct. 11 -No Monday Recycling collection – will be collected throughout the week.

ELECTION DAY:

Tuesday November 2- Normal trash collection.

VETERANS DAY:

Thursday November 11- Trash and Recycling ONLY will be collected Friday.

Friday November 12- Trash will be collected on Monday November 15

THANKSGIVING DAY and DAY AFTER:

Thursday November 25 Trash and Recyclables will be collected Friday November 26 and Friday November 26 Trash and Recyclables will be collected Monday November 29

CHRISTMAS DAY:

Celebrated Friday Dec 24 - Trash and Recyclables will be collected Monday Dec 27

NEW YEARS DAY 2011:

Celebrated Friday Dec 31- Trash and Recyclables will be collected Monday January 3

LEAF COLLECTION

Leaf collection is offered for the months of April, October, November, and December.

*** Leaf Collection Schedule***

Spring

Week of April 5 – East of Main St
Week of April 12 – West of Main St.
Week of April 19 – East of Main St.
Week of April 26 – West of Main St.

Fall

Week of October 4 – East of Main St.
Week of October 11 – West of Main St.
Week of October 18 – East of Main St.
Week of October 25 – West of Main St
Week of November 1 – East of Main St.
Week of November 8 – West of Main St.
Week of November 15– East of Main St.
Week of November 22 – West of Main St.
Week of November 29 – East of Main St.
Week of December 6 – West of Main St.
Week of December 13 – East of Main St.
Week of December 20 – West of Main St.

- Rake your leaves loose to the curb line.
- Leaves shall be free of any sticks, rocks, stones, trash, brush and other debris that could damage or clog the Leaf Vacuuming machines.
- Please keep leaves at least 10 feet away from storm drains.
- Inclement weather does affect leaf collection.
- The Borough is not responsible for damage to Basketball backboards or other obstructions in the street.

NOTE: Leaves may be placed in biodegradable paper bags or yard debris containers at any time. Biodegradable paper bags can be purchased at Borough Hall or any lawn and garden store.

SNOW REMOVAL

To assist the Highway Department with snow removal from all municipal dedicated streets, roadways, and cul-de-sacs, all parked cars and obstructions shall be removed from the street for up to 12 hours during and after a storm.

- When shoveling OUT of your driveway, snow should be placed to the right side (if looking at the street from house), of your driveway. This may help alleviate snow being plowed back into the driveway.
- If using a snow blower, please, do not blow snow back out into the street as hazardous conditions can arise.
- During a snow storm all primary streets will be plowed first, followed by the secondary streets. Cul-de-sacs will be done last due the clearing time involved and use of other equipment.
- The plows try to get as close to the curb as possible.
- Please clear the area around your mailbox as the Mail carriers will not deliver the mail if they can not reach your mailbox. (If you are in an area that is difficult to clear around the mailbox, such as cul-de-sacs, you could install a temporary box on a post as close to the cleared area as possible.)
- The Borough is not responsible for damage to Basketball backboards or other obstructions in the street.
- Residents and businesses that are located on a corner are responsible for clearing sidewalk handicapped ramp curb cut areas.
