VIETNAM ERA HISTORY THE FOCUS OF OCTOBER EXHIBIT IN DOWNTOWN GLASSBORO MUSEUM

GLASSBORO—The history of the Vietnam War era will be the focus of a month-long exhibit at The South Jersey Museum of American History located in downtown Glassboro from October 1-30. The show will cover the turbulent years from 1963 to 1974--from the assassination of John F. Kennedy to the end of the Vietnam War--including Woodstock, Watergate and the Symbionese Liberation Army.

“This latest exhibit represents the South Jersey Museum of American History’s continuing commitment to provide critical focus on events that have molded American society. The Borough of Glassboro is grateful to the museum for making these exhibits possible for the community,” said Glassboro Councilman Joe D’Alessandro.

“The South Jersey Museum of American History’s permanent exhibits include artifacts from the pre-Columbian through the Colonial Era, farmstead and antique hand tools, the Pine Barrens, glass and a comprehensive political history exhibit,” said curator Jeffrey Norcross.

The South Jersey Museum of American History is open Thursday, Friday, Saturday, and Sunday 1:00-5:00 p.m. Admission is \$4 for adults and \$3 for children. Group rates are available.
